About Podgorica

As the capital and largest city, Podgorica serves as Montenegro's administrative and cultural hub. Situated at the confluence of five rivers—Morača, Ribnica, Zeta, Cijevna, and Sitnica—the city boasts a mix of modern architecture and historical sites. Key attractions include:

- **Stara Varoš:** The Ottoman-era Old Town with narrow streets and traditional buildings.
- **Ribnica Bridge:** A historic stone bridge offering picturesque views.
- **Gorica Hill:** A green oasis perfect for hiking and panoramic city views.
- **Niagara Falls (Cijevna Waterfalls):** A scenic natural attraction just outside the city.
- **Saborni Hram Hristovog Vaskrsenja:** A prominent Orthodox cathedral known for its stunning architecture.

Getting to Podgorica

- **By Air:** Podgorica Airport (TGD) is located approximately 12 km from the city center and offers regular flights to and from major European cities.
- **By Land:** Montenegro shares borders with Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia, Kosovo, and Albania, making it accessible by car or bus from neighboring countries.
- **By Sea:** While Podgorica itself is inland, the Montenegrin coast is accessible via ports like Bar and Kotor, with ferry connections to several Adriatic destinations.

Entry Requirements

- **Visa:** Citizens of many countries can enter Montenegro without a visa for stays up to 90 days.
- **Passport Validity:** Passports must be valid at the time of entry.
- **Currency Declaration:** Amounts exceeding €10,000 must be declared upon entry or exit.

Currency & Payments

- **Currency:** Euro (€)
- **ATMs:** Widely available in urban areas.
- **Credit Cards:** Accepted in most establishments, though cash is preferred in smaller towns and markets.

Shopping Hours

- **Convenience stores and Supermarkets:** Typically open Monday to Saturday from 7:00 AM to 9:30 PM. (some can work longer)

- **Bakeries and pharmacies** in certain areas may also be open on Sundays.
